More than one third (34 percent) of men aged over 40 report having one or more reproductive health problems, all being more common among older men. About one in seven Australian men over 40 years will suffer from problems with their prostate; most commonly with Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia (BPH). About one in five Australian men over the age of 40 have problems getting or keeping an erection. There are several effective options for successful treatment.

This session aims to increase the understanding of the patho-physiology of these conditions to ensure accurate diagnosis, timely therapy and improve patient outcomes. Management resources and guidelines will be provided.
